

Pets on Patios



Per Colorado Food Code §6-501.115, pets are not permitted in retail food establishments (including outdoor patios). This prohibition does not include service animals, which are always allowed. For more detailed information about service animals, please see the Service Animal Guidance at www.sjbpublichealth.org.

Pets may be allowed on outdoor patios under certain circumstances, which requires a variance issued by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE). Any retail food establishment may request a variance from any requirement of the Colorado Retail Food Establishment Rules and Regulations when the establishment believes that the requirement results in an undue economic hardship or when it is believed that a standard may not apply to the specific situation. Before requesting a variance, the establishment should create a plan and policies/procedures that address the following (at a minimum):

- ✿ Where dogs are prohibited and allowed; including how patrons access dog allowable areas
- ✿ Patron (dog owner) rules/expectations (for example, clean-up after their pet, supervision, leashes, vaccinations, where they are/are not allowed, etc.)
- ✿ Staff Training
- ✿ Staff maintenance of grounds
- ✿ Staff clean-up procedure/sanitation
- ✿ RFE food preparation and storage
- ✿ Cleaning of dog bowls
- ✿ Injuries and incidents
- ✿ Other relevant information
